ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

This event is organized by the Regional Initiative for Culture and Creativity (RICC), in collaboration with the European Commission, the Committee of the Regions, EURADA and ERRIN networks. The aim is to look at the state of play and the future of Cultural and Creative Industries in Europe.
